

Lox Lane

I know that Lox Lane has a special place in many of your hearts, as it does in mine. It has been a place where over the years hundreds of people have encountered the Father of comfort and have experienced his transforming love. I believe that in the coming years the work there will accelerate as more and more hungry people come and find refuge in Him and learn his ways.

The property was built by the Grosvenor family (of Grosvenor Square, London fame) in 1863 and is a little bit like the Forth Road Bridge always needing attention. In the future we have plans to build a new meeting room with extra accommodation over the top. We also have in mind to renew the kitchen & dining area, when those ideas are a little more developed we will let you know.

In the meantime we have to pay some attention to more urgent needs;

1. We want to replace the windows and doors that have really come to the end of their lives. This is about 40 windows and doors in the Barn, Library, Upper room, Farmhouse and the block of Units 1 – 4. The quote for this is £20,000 fitted.
2. The South West gable end at the Farmhouse which for scaffolding and materials will be about £2,000. We think we have some skilled volunteers who will do the work.
3. Some renovations in the Barn where Steve and Rachel and their family are living. We have to change the upstairs bathroom, do some work on the kitchen and change the hall carpets. Steve and Rachel are happy to do the work but it will cost about £4,000 in materials.

We have already got £10,000 that people have committed towards this and are confident the Lord will help us with the rest.

This is simply information for anyone who would like to help us with Lox Lane – an opportunity to store up some treasure in heaven as you invest in the future of changed lives. I know it's not for everybody and so there is no pressure in this appeal.
